Chancellor announces Southwestern Regional Executive Officer/Dean

MADISON – Cathy Sandeen, Chancellor of University of Wisconsin Colleges and University of Wisconsin-Extension, named Dr. Charles Clark to the newly created position of Southwestern Regional Executive Officer/Dean. Clark will oversee UW-Baraboo/Sauk County, UW-Richland, and UW-Rock County.

Under the new administrative model announced in July, the 13 UW Colleges will be grouped into four regions, with one Executive Officer/Dean per region. Among their responsibilities, the Regional Executive Officer/Dean will provide academic and strategic leadership to the campuses in the region, and work collaboratively with faculty and staff members, and students to establish policies and practices that ensure regional and campus success.

“I am very pleased to be serving the UW Colleges in the Southwestern region. I look forward to working with my colleagues, University of Wisconsin System students, and the region’s residents, elected officials, and community leaders in service to the state,” said Clark

As Regional Executive Officer/Dean, Clark will be expected to continue to develop and maintain strong and productive relationships with local government, business and community leaders within his region.

Clark is the current Campus Executive Officer/Dean at UW- Manitowoc. He previously served as Associate Dean of the College of Letters and Science at UW-Stevens Point and Executive Assistant to the Chancellor and Provost. Clark earned a doctorate in history at the University of Illinois at Urbana, his master’s degree in Soviet and East European Studies at University of Kansas, and his bachelor’s degree in history at Moorhead State University.

“Dr. Clark is an impressive, experienced educational leader who has proven, positive results in serving his students and communities,” said Chancellor Sandeen. “As the UW Colleges undergo these dramatic but necessary changes, I am confident he understands what it takes for his campuses to succeed, and how important that success is for students, his region, and the state.”

The transition to Regional Executive Officers/Deans will begin immediately, with an expected completion date of mid-December. The current Campus Executive Officers/Deans will play a key role in facilitating the transition and bridging new relationships. The Campus Executive Officers/Dean positions then will be eliminated effective Dec. 31, 2015. All current Campus

Executive Officers/Deans are tenured faculty members and will be deciding whether to accept teaching positions within the UW Colleges.
